Mae Cynghrair Gweithwyr y Tir (LWA) yn undeb o ffermwyr, cynhyrchwyr, coedwigwyr a phobl sy'n gweithio ar y tir ledled y DU. Ein nod yw gwella bywoliaeth ein haelodau a chreu gwell system o fwyd a thir i bawb. Mae gennym weledigaeth o ddyfodol lle gall cynhyrchwyr weithio ag urddas i ennill bywoliaeth deg, a lle gall bawb gael mynediad at fwyd, tanwydd a ffibrau iachus a fforddiadwy yn lleol - system fwyd a defnydd tir sy'n seiliedig ar agroecoleg a sofraniaeth bwyd, ac sy'n gwella cyfiawnder cymdeithasol ac amgylcheddol.

Rydym yn sefydliad dynamig a bywiog sydd ar gychwyn cyfnod cyffrous o dwf. Hours: 24 hours (3 days) per week.

Duration: This role is supported by two separately funded projects which have different end dates. Current funding covers 3 days per week until March 2023 and then 1 day per week until September 2023. We hope to get additional funding to extend the full role to September 2023 or beyond.

Location: Working remotely from home with the capacity for regular travel for work, events and meetings in Wales, Scotland and England

The Landworkers' Alliance (LWA) is a union of farmers, growers, foresters and land-based workers operating across the UK. Our mission is to improve the livelihoods of our members and create a better food and land-use system for everyone. We have a vision of a future where producers can work with dignity to earn a decent living and everyone can access local, healthy and affordable food, fuel and fibre - a food and land-use system based on agroecology and food sovereignty that furthers social and environmental justice.

We are a dynamic and vibrant organisation that is in an exciting phase of growth. Over the coming years we aim to significantly increase our membership base and expand member support and services, scale-out our projects and programmes, significantly advance our positions in policy making and develop our internal governance and organisational capability for this ambitious stage of growth.

Mode of Working:

The LWA is a members' cooperative represented by a Coordinating Group of directors elected by members at the Annual General Meeting. The Coordinating Group steers the strategic, financial, governance and political work of the organisation and is also legally responsible for the management and operation of the LWA. Staff work in line with cooperative principles and in addition to specific job responsibilities may be required to participate in General Meetings and work teams as part of their hours, or additional paid time if needed.

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The LWA does not have a centralised office and our staff work remotely but may be required to attend meetings that take place in various locations around the country. Reasonable travel costs will be covered in addition to the salary, however, this means candidates must have the skills and confidence to work remotely as part of a diverse team and a proven capacity to self-manage and work autonomously.

The use of personal IT equipment is required for this role. If this poses a challenge for you we encourage you to get in touch (contact details below) as we do not wish this to be a barrier to applying.

Role overview and job description:

We are seeking a confident, skilled communicator, facilitator and organiser, who is passionate about building local food systems and has a good understanding of the complex issues and dynamics surrounding food and farming. The role consists of two main projects, each with separate funding.

Building Resilient and Local Food Systems Project Worker (2 days per week)

This project is UK wide and has three main areas of work:

- Supporting start-ups and helping businesses switch to shorter supply chains and direct marketing systems.
- Helping farmers and food businesses address and overcome barriers to developing local and short supply chain food systems through cooperation.
- Campaigning and advocacy work to help create a policy and regulatory environment that allows local and short supply chain businesses to thrive .

The role involves: Organising and facilitating webinars and farm visits; researching and developing written guides for producers and food businesses; fostering collaboration within and between local food systems; and developing relevant policy recommendations.

You will be working closely with the Resilient and Local Food System Coordinator to deliver the key elements of the project. There is considerable flexibility about how you define your role within this project, and to focus on the specific areas which you feel play to your strengths.

Welsh Food Hubs Project Liaison (1 day per week)

This role involves working on a project establishing five local food hubs throughout Wales as part of the multi-stranded, multi-partner Resilient Green Spaces project, led by Social Farms & Gardens. The role will work with Open Food Network, Development Trusts Association Wales, and Social Farms & Gardens. The work primarily involves leveraging the LWA network to support the success of this project, and representing the interests of our membership in how this project is implemented.

This post is funded through the Welsh Government Rural Communities Rural Development Programme 2014-2020, which is funded by the Welsh Government and the European Union.

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Teams

This role will work closely with the Resilient Local Food Systems Project Team, the Communications Coordinator, and the Membership Team.

Specific responsibilities and outputs of this role will be:

Resilient Local Food System Project Development Worker: Working with the Resilient Local Food Systems Coordinator to develop the project. Specific responsibilities will include:

- Organising and running webinars on short supply chain marketing.
- Organising farmer exchange visits focusing on the implications of local and short supply chain marketing systems for production systems, infrastructure and management .
- Fostering collaboration between different parts of the supply chain through workshops.
- Representing the Landworkers' Alliance at meetings and workshops

Welsh Food Hubs Project Liaison: Coordinating project specific communications and promotion, initially, to inform potential applicants about the food hub opportunity, then to build the customer base and producers using the food hubs.

- Organising and facilitating producers to use hubs, including providing support and advice to farmers and growers to produce food for and sell through food hubs.
- Collaborating with partner organisations to deliver five new food hubs across Wales representing the interests of small-scale farmers.
- Communicating with members, funders and other organisations working in the field.

Person Specification: The appropriate candidate will have the following skills and experiences:

Essential:

- Experience of grassroots organising or membership building for an organisation (ideally a union or community organisation).
- Familiarity with the issues facing UK agricultural sector and the food supply chain.
- Excellent personal organisation skills with proven capacity to self-manage and work autonomously.
- Good communication skills.
- Confidence in doing public presentations.
- Confidence facilitating meetings and building long term relationships.
- Ability to travel for meetings and events (you must hold a full Driving licence)
- A passion and commitment to agroecology and a better food system.

Desirable:

- Strong skills and confidence working and collaborating as part of a diverse, busy team operating with cooperative principles.

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- Experience working well in partnership with other food, farming and land use organisations
- Experience creating knowledge exchange or educational materials.
- Confidence using excel and databases, and designing newsletters on platforms such as Mailchimp.
- A taste for numbers, finance, business models and the nuts and bolts of making complicated food and farm businesses work.
- Event planning experience.
- Experience running or working for a land-based business.
- Familiarity with digital marketing platforms.
